By providing students with skills integral to the understanding and adoption of proper styles suitable for each type of composition, including the following: structure appropriate for the purpose of text (e.g. argumentative, descriptive or explanatory, persuasive essay / paragraph); grammatical components (e.g. collocations, tense, transitional words, punctuations); lexicon (e.g. synonyms / thesaurus, word connotation, jargons), and references (e.g. paraphrase, citation)

For serving as a tool of successful communication that conveys acquired knowledge in a specific field of study, aiding students in the analysis of content, conveyance of acknowledgement, critical thinking, and focuses particularly on technique and style.
