I. COURSE DESCRIPTION

This "English for University Preparation" course is designed for students of all levels of background in English examination. It provides essential details of each kind of the examinations required for the admission to both Thai and overseas universities. The format and skills required for English standard tests required for university admission. The course examines, explores, and enhances in students four English skills crucial to achieving satisfactory results and high scores: listening, reading, writing, and speaking. Its emphases are on CU-TEP, CU-ATT (verbal part), SAT (verbal part), TU-GET, TOEFL, IELTS, and GAT. The goal is to prepare students to be ready for university admission and classes.

By using several methods to teach four important skills, this course will help the students accomplish their goals in the university. For instance, reading strategies and keywords analysis will be taught to students to help them work faster and thus save some time during the Reading Comprehension part of the exam. Each grammar lessons will be explained and given example of its practical use in both written and spoken English to allow students to apply and integrate into other contexts. English dialogues spoken by native speakers will also be displayed to help familiarize students with real conversations and prepare them for the Listening part of the exam. Students are given practice tests to determine their English capacity and be made accustomed to each standardized test; the practice tests typically consist of reading comprehension, error detection, cloze tests, and vocabularies.

For acquiring the knowledge and new skills, this course includes practice with stimulating tests and discussions the way to improve their abilities. Hence, the students will be familiar with any test and get higher score in the examination that they have to take for the university.
